

rescue Student Service Projects Village

(13 & older)

- For students needing a short-term project to fulfill service requirements for school, church, scouts, honors societies, clubs, etc.
- Students should check to see if the project meets the organizations requirements. Individuals track hours spent.
- Finalized projects can be brought to Rescue Village during adoption hours. Students will then receive a letter verifying the work done.



Host a Donation Drive

Put a shout out to friends, family, teachers, and classmates that you are collecting bedding to donate to the animals at RV. This includes donations of fleece! Make and decorate a large bin to collect them in!

Pennies for Pets

- Decorate a donation jar/can
- Put it out at an event (party, birthday, dinner)
- Ask your school, church, or clubs if you can put it out or leave one in each room.
- Collect the funds and convert change to bills or gift cards for the animals.

Lead a Store-Based **Donation Drive**

- 1. Contact the pet store you wish to engage (PetSmart, Petco, Pet People/Hollywood Feed).
- 2. Ask about setting up a donation table by the entrance/in front of the store to collect donations for Rescue Village.
- 3. While people enter hand them the Wishlist below for while they stop.
- 4. People will drop their items in the homemade, decorated bin you design for by your table.

Sell for Donations

Love making treats and toys for animals? Gather your group of friends and give back to your community and the animals at RV.

- 1. Decorate a large bin to collect items.
- 2. Setup a table and sell your homemade items.
- 3. The funds raised will then be brought to Rescue Village as a donation!

Event Flyer Hanging

Rescue Village can use help flyering for RV's Woofstock Dog Festival in September. From June through September, help hang flyers at local businesses on the RV list, find new ones, and add them to the list!

- 1. Arrive at RV and ask the Welcome Desk for flyers. Take tape and offer to hang it! This makes it more likely to be put up.
- 2. Hours will be verified when a returned list of locations and pictures of flyers hung are provided

Animal Advocates

Advocate for animal welfare to legislators in the House of Representatives and the Senate.

Students may choose an area of interest related to animal welfare and research current bills that align. Students can write advocating for the advancement of a policy or the appeal of a current policy.

This may include the following:

Breed specific legislation
Spay/neuter laws
Addressing barriers to adoption
Anti-Animal Cruelty Laws by state/county
Expanding pet-friendly housing opportunities
Increasing access to veterinary care
Puppy mills
Ending house slaughter
Disaster planning for species
Opposing extreme-speed slaughter

Animal Advocates

Advocate for animal welfare to the House of Representatives and Senate legislators.

- 1. Find a current policy in Congress to focus on using https://www.congress.gov/
- 2. Read up on the bill's activity.
- 3. Find a member(s) to write to:

https://www.congress.gov/membersq=%7B%22congress%22%3A118%7D

- You can choose Democrat or Republican members in the House of Representatives or Senate
- Can be Ohio representatives or any state within the US.
- *Note: be sure to specify your research so it is relevant to the city/state you choose.
- *Ex: Arguing cold, inclement weather would not be relevant for Florida members.

4. Creeping for a Cause

- o Once a member catches your eye, click "More on this Member" on the right.
- Read up on your member's previously supported and opposing policies.
- What is their policy focus?
- What is their background? A Google search is best here.
- What committees are they serving on? Listed in "more on..."

5. Do your Research!

- o Once you know your policy to focus on, use your passion to gain knowledge in the area!
- o Research topics related to the bill, events, and laws aligned with your perspective.
- What is the opposing argument?
- Are there additional resources or policies that need to be considered for the bill?
- What similar laws/bills have been proposed or passed?

6. Write & Send a Persuasive Letter

- Discuss your passion and use research to reiterate the importance of legislative support
- Targeting members who will likely support and those who will likely oppose.
- Identify research that supports, mentions opposition, and counter with closing research. .
- *Note: These letters may look different! Think about how to frame each.

Information Sheet

Rescue Village is a private, non-profit 501(c)3 organization solely reliant on donations and grants for funding.

ADOPTION PROCESS INCLUDES

- · Rescue Village does not have barriers to adoption (i.e., housing type, income, occupation, etc.).
- Same-day adoption following onsite counseling.
- Spay/Neuter surgeries for all adoptable animals.
- Dogs and cats are microchipped before adoption.
- All animals receive treatment for external/internal parasites.
- Full DA2PP or FVRCP vaccinations.
- Included rabies vaccines for animals three months or older.
- · All dogs receive a Bordetella vaccine.
- All Cats are tested for Feline Leukemia.
- · All dogs over six months old are tested for heartworm disease.
- · Free initial examination by participating vets.
- Adoption Packet and ongoing staff support.
- Dogs receive a Geauga County Dog License.



Offers low-cost spay/neuter options to owned pets.

Adoptable Cats and Dogs

· All cats and dogs are put up for adoption after being spayed, neutered, microchipped, and vaccinated.

Rescue Village Guardian Program

· Provides temporary fostering for Geauga County residents in crisis.

Pet Food Pantry

· Provides free pet food for residents in need.

Woofstock

· Annual dog festival and ramble walk with vendors, food, and family fun with dogs to raise funds for the animals at Rescue Village.
